SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

With winter coming, we would like your cooperation during snow removal. We ask that you please move your vehicles either off the street or as far off as you can get when there's snow in the forecast. This will greatly increase the amount of snow we can remove and will decrease the amount of time it takes. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!

FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT - SAMANTHA GORDON

For any development within the floodplain you are required to get a Floodplain Development Permit Application. This includes new construction, grading, fill, excavation, fences/walls, and remodel/rehab. If you don't know if you are in the floodplain or not you can stop in and we can look into it prior to starting any new project. You may also find out by going to Nebraska Department of Natural Resources website and looking at their interactive map. Also, it is a good idea to have flood insurance even if you do not have a loan where you are required to have such policy. If you have any other questions feel free to give me a call anytime at the Village office.
